2019 PHYSICAL PLANT RENOVATIONS

This fall the Alumni Association embarks on a quarter-million-dollar renovation to the façade of the Commonwealth Avenue side of our houses. The main goal is to replace the windows with new ones that will operate better to keep out the Boston winter cold while still maintaining "High Georgian" historical appearance.

Alumni Board director Sean Beausoleil '88, Chairman of the Physical Plant Committee, is planning and overseeing the work. The work itself is being managed by the Stukel Group, LLC.

The twenty-seven windows on 487 (the Chapter House) and 485 were installed in the 1990s, twenty-four of these will be replaced as part of this project. The wood frames surrounding the windows will be kept and repaired/painted as needed. The large bay windows of the chapter room will be replaced as will be the two oriel windows on 485 with their exterior metal framework.

During this renovation several other smaller projects will be done while we have the workers *continued on page 2*

and equipment on site. This includes replacing the sidewalks leading to the front steps and repairing the front steps themselves to remove tripping hazards and water leaks into the basement. The exterior metal railings will also be replaced. Finally, the mortar will be re-pointed as needed on the front of the building and the roof.

The work will be done during the fall term while the building is occupied, but efforts are being made to minimize disruption to the brothers living in the Comm Ave facing rooms. The workmen will only need a few feet of space cleared from the front of each window while work is in progress in a particular room.

This project was made possible by a generous donation from David Vogel '95 as part of our Capital Campaign. Because the renovation is designed to preserve and protect the historic nature of our 19th century home the donation was tax deductible. Our Alumni Association is working with MIT's Independent Residence Development Fund (IRDF) to make donations for such projects even easier in the future. More information about this program and the Capital Campaign will be going out to our alumni soon.

OUTSTANDING ALUMNI ASSN

This past July the 67th General Convention of Phi Sigma Kappa was held in Dallas, Texas. Among the regular business of electing a new Grand President and new Grand Council members, the convention also features awards to recognize the achievements of the undergraduate chapters and alumni. This year Omicron took home the award for Outstanding Alumni Club.

In the spring all chapters and alumni clubs fill out their end-of-year reports and award applications, this is done by the Chapter Secretary and the Alumni Secretary respectively. An awards committee from National Headquarters reviews the applications and choose those chapters and clubs deserving of special recognition. The awards are presented at the opening and closing banquets of the Convention.

Omicron took home three awards from the opening banquet. The Outstanding Alumni Club award recognized our work in maintaining the physical plant, managing our financial responsibilities, and working with the undergraduates on risk management, officer transition, and chapter operations. The undergrads took home well-deserved awards for Philanthropy and Community Involvement (both neighborhood and campus).

This year's convention was attended by Chapter VP Jan Wojcik '21, Sentinel Abram Turner '21, Nate Walma '22, and Alumni Secretary/Adviser Joe McMahon '85. Delegations from every chapter and most alumni clubs attended workshops on leadership, risk management, chapter operations, and had many opportunities to socialize and exchange ideas on strengthening their organizations.

TECH REUNIONS 2019

Class of 1969 held 50th reunion event at the Chapter House following Commencement.

Every year on the weekend of commencement MIT hosts its "Tech Reunions" and Phi Sig has been holding an open house and reception for visiting alumni, graduating seniors, their families, and friends. TREASURER REPORT


Treasurer Report from 2018 Alumni Meeting.

Alex Tellez' 87, Treasurer

This past year we had a contribution to surplus from operations of almost \$63K, which was approximately \$32K more than budget. Our income was right on budget with Chapter Rent of \$224K and Sway Spa Rent of \$35.4K. Our maintenance / repair expenses were \$51.5K, just slightly above budget. But we did not kick off the capital campaign as planned, so we spent \$7K less than budget on Alumni communications and mailings and \$26K less than budget on architects and attorneys. We ended the fiscal year with \$227K in liquid assets plus \$222K in the SPGH (Society for the Preservation of Greek Housing) account for capital improvements. Our IRDF loan/mortgage was paid down to a balance of less than \$728K.

We left the board meeting last year agreeing to pursue more architectural and legal work in preparation for a capital campaign, but we got de-railed early with higher than expected quotes for virtual fly-throughs and we never recovered. So we are pretty much where we left off - before kicking off a capital campaign, we need to identify one alumnus that's able and willing to contribute at least \$750K and 2 to 3 more that are willing to contribute in the \$250K to \$500K range (please note that these contributions are usually made over a 5 year period). We may also want to engage an architect with experience in green buildings and sustainability to design features that will allow us to receive additional grants and donations. Please contact me (pskalumnitreas@mit.edu) if you or any alumni you know of may be willing to contribute or volunteer time to the capital campaign.

Please refer to the subsequent pages for the FY2018 financial statements and the FY2019 budget. This year we only increased Chapter Rent by 2.67% to \$230K for FY2019. We expect that after these past 3 catch-up years, the rent increases over the next few years can be limited to 2%, so the FY2020 rent would be \$234,600. Without budgeting for any capital campaign contributions, we expect to have a \$35K surplus next year.
